Apologies for missing the names of attendees who joined in between, stayed for a while and left the meeting. Following points were discussed during the meeting.

1. Dr Joshi requested new attendees to introduce themselves. Dr. Anita Sawant, Raghav Rajput, Sania Sainkar introduced themselves accordingly.
2. **Regarding application for recognition of LAMP COURSE by NMC for UG students**, Dr. Joshi requested Dr. Jamkar to explain the details. In furtherance of this Dr. Jamkar asked about details about the LAMP course, Dr. Joshi provided the details accordingly. After which Dr. Jamkar said that previously the ATCOM module was only for 2 months in the first M.B.B.S. Now it is extended for all semesters for each subject whose details were provided on the page no. 61 of the document provided in the notice of meeting and he read those details. He suggested that MLSI should prepare a curriculum based on this module and submit for recognition to NMC.
3. **Regarding differential access to the website of MLSI**, Dr. Nitin Dhande suggested that there should be a selective approach to the website of MLSI. Some data should be accessible to members only. On this Dr Joshi replied that for doing this someone from us has to take responsibility, if someone is ready to take responsibility, we can discuss this. Dr Sanjay Gupte said that while he agrees that some information on the website should be only for members, we can not expect Dr Rajeev Joshi to do everything single handedly. Dr. Dhande replied that he is ready to take responsibility and he will first enquire about charges to be incurred in doing so. Dr Rajeev Joshi requested him to discuss

with software developers and get the cost of the changes required for such differential access and present them at the time of next meeting.

- 4. Regarding Data related to spurious drugs,** Dr. Joshi requested members to suggest how data related to spurious drugs can be obtained. This data is required to support the issue of spurious drugs raised by us in our IA. Dr. Jamkar suggested that pharmacists should be bound to inform the prescribing doctor about the brand of drug given to the patient. To this Dr. Joshi replied that this will need IT based infrastructure. Dr. Raichur said that this will only increase the burden of prescribing doctors without providing any practical benefit in patient care. Dr. Joshi interrupted the discussion and said that our issue is how to collect data of spurious drugs. Dr. Raichur said that we have to do research and collect data from the news articles available on the internet. This research can be done by a student and he is ready to become a guide for this. Dr. Jamkar suggested taking help from IMA, to this Dr. Joshi replied that we can collect this data through google form and collaborate with IMA in this regard.
- 5. Regarding Data to be collected for violence against medical professionals,** Dr. Joshi said that as per information received from various groups of doctors from Kerala, there has been a decrease in incidences of violence after the direction of Kerala HC and amendment in Act by legislature. Now we need data related to violence from Maharashtra to submit at Bombay HC. Dr. Jamkar informed about recent incidence of violence committed at symbiosis medical College where a Junior resident was beaten by relatives for communicating with a patient and threatened to commit more violence if informed to police as a result of this JR is not willing to register FIR and asked about any solution to register FIR as Dean is ready to take action against relatives. On this Dr. Joshi asked whether there are any provisions in CrPC? Dr. Khatod replied that as per section 154, it is not necessary that an informant should be a victim. Any person who has knowledge of commission of offense can inform the police and as per section 176 of IPC failure to give such information is also an offense so Dean can give information to police. Dr. Jamkar said that he will talk with Dean and will try to get FIR registered. Dr. Joshi informed that tomorrow he is going to Mumbai to argue before Bombay HC in PIL/ IA of violence against medical professionals. and will inform the details of the hearing.
